It is designed to impart extensive training and assessment for the students. The program seeks to delve into the intricacies of Kuchipudi dance, Indian culture and traditions, and also extends comparison with other Indian Classical dance forms. The program culminates into a transcendental experience that rejuvenates the body and mind into this sublime world of dance.



PROGRAM LEARNING OUTCOMES

- 1. A broader perspective of Kuchipudi Dance through exposure to social history while the knowledge of the indigenous texts will have been made stronger.
- 2. Developed contextualized knowledge of each genre of Indian dance forms, Kuchipudi in particular, so that the temporal and spatial points of view are absorbed and the historiography is seamless and experiential.
- 3. Strengthened knowledge of music and the intricacies of rhythm typical to Kuchipudi form to take charge as the leader of the performing team.
- 4. Honed research instincts and writing skills to produce excellent theses.
- 5. Developed scholar-practitioner skills to present an original choreography which showcases the knowledge and experience gained on the canvas of the traditional aesthetic.
